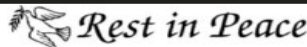

Dear Parishioners,

Early voting for this year's national election began yesterday and Election Day is Tuesday, November 3rd. Previously, I stated in the Sunday bulletin about the necessity to vote **NO** to **Proposition 1** which is disguised as the "Equal Protection of Law Amendment." This imposing and unsafe legislation will impact the Right to Life and the sacredness of family life.

The Catholic bishops of New York State have issued a statement entitled, "A Wolf in Sheep's Clothing," suggesting a **negative** vote to Proposal 1. As the statement says, "The measure would, effectively, permanently legalize abortion without restriction and up until the moment of birth in New York State." In addition, regarding parents and their children, "Courts could decide that parents have no authority over their minor children on important matters and permit children to make destructive and permanent decisions on their own which they could live to regret, including but not limited to so called 'gender affirming' treatments and surgeries."

Today's bulletin contains an important "Talking Points on Proposition 1" and I encourage you and your family members to read it carefully and share your thoughts with each other. Let us pray this amendment will be defeated and we can continue to build a society based on just and moral principles.

TALKING POINTS ON PROPOSITION 1

Proposition 1: Equal Protection of Law Amendment – how it will appear on the ballot:

"This proposal would protect against unequal treatment based on ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, and sex, including sexual orientation, gender identity and pregnancy. It also protects against unequal treatment based on reproductive healthcare and autonomy."

WHY OPPOSE PROPOSITION 1? Prop 1 could expand abortion access and reduce parental authority in decisions related to minors, particularly regarding gender-affirming treatments.

- Unrestricted Abortion:** While the Equal Rights Amendment suggests equality, Catholics are urged to oppose Proposal 1, as it would permanently legalize unrestricted abortion in New York, potentially leading to harmful consequences for unborn children.
- Parental Rights at Risk:** The amendment's language could strip parents of their rights over decisions regarding their children, particularly in matters such as "gender-affirming" treatments, transferring authority to courts.
- Dangerous Consequences:** Proposal 1 could have lasting negative impacts on families and unborn children, serving political agendas while disregarding the sacred parent-child relationship and the protection of life.
- Girls Sports Threatened:** Opponents say the law would also grant boys and men the right to compete in girls and women's sports, by elevating 'gender identity' to a constitutional right.

CATHOLIC RESPONSIBILITY

- Vote Responsibly:** Catholics are encouraged to reflect on critical issues, educate themselves, and vote with an informed conscience to promote the common good on key moral issues such as the dignity of human life and social justice.
- Catholics' Role in Politics:** Catholics are encouraged to actively engage in the political process by voting and contributing to public policy discussions, while the Church remains non-partisan.
- Catholic Voices in Politics:** The Church values the involvement of Catholics in various political parties to bring their faith-based perspectives to the discussion, guided by Gospel teachings.
- Pray for Guidance:** Catholics are encouraged to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance in their discernment of candidates and policies to foster leaders who support the common good.

CATHOLIC TEACHINGS

- The Church's Moral Foundation:** The dignity of every human person, from conception to natural death, is central to the Church's political and social stance, informing its opposition to issues like abortion, euthanasia, and racism.
- Human Rights and Right to Life:** The right to life is seen as foundational, and without it, other rights cannot stand. Without the protection of life, other rights become vulnerable and lose their significance. Without the right to life, the pursuit of liberty, justice, and human dignity is impossible, as every other human right depends on the basic right to exist and be protected from harm.

USCCB GUIDANCE - The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has provided the document "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" to help guide Catholics in their voting decisions, encouraging them to reflect on the truth of the Gospel.

This Sunday, October 27th at 9:30 AM, we welcome our Grade/Level 7 students to their Investiture Mass. Investiture is a requirement for continuation towards the sacrament of confirmation. Candidates seeking confirmation are reminded that a regular habit of Mass attendance is a spiritual duty of all Catholics.

Friday, November 1 is All Saints Day! According to the website *Catholic Culture*, "During the year the Church celebrates one by one the feasts of the saints. Today she joins them all in one festival. In addition to those whose names she knows, she recalls in a magnificent vision all the others of all nations and tribes standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands, proclaiming Him who redeemed them in His Blood." All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation.

Saturday, November 2nd is All Souls Day! The Church commemorates all the faithful departed and issues a call to prayer for those who have died and are being purified in final preparation for their entrance into the Beatific Vision. "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned." (CCC#1030-31).

Sunday, November 3rd at 9:30 AM, our Grade/Level 2 children seeking the sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist, must attend Mass which is followed by a mini-retreat in the Church basement.

Did you know? In her autobiography, *Story of a Soul*, St. Thérèse described how Our Lady of Victories healed her from a mysterious illness. She said that the Blessed Virgin appeared to her and that her beautiful smile made all her pain disappear.

ALL SAINTS DAY takes place this Friday, November 1st. It is a holyday of obligation for all Catholics. The Mass schedule is Thursday, October 31st at 7:00 p.m. and on Friday, November 1st at 8:30 a.m.

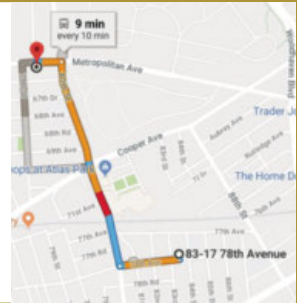
