

Dear Parishioners,

Let's talk about stamps. Postage stamps. Each year at this time I go to the Post Office and request Christmas stamps, not the holiday ones but the religious ones. This year the religious image is an image of the Madonna and Child and as the United States Postal Service (USPS) describes: "This artwork depicts a watchful Madonna, her head tilted toward the sleeping Christ child-resting against her. She wears a blue cloak and a dark red gown, from which off-white undersleeves emerge at the elbows. A beige veil, reminiscent of a halo, covers part of her light brown hair. Her child appears partially in beige cloth. The background is brown and a gold border frames the image."

For history buffs among us, the first religious Christmas stamp owes its origin in part to the lobbying efforts of Anthony Coviello, a parishioner at Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Waterbury, CT. The 1966 stamp, "Madonna and Child with Angels," started a trend of Christmas stamps featuring Renaissance paintings. The series was interrupted in 1977 when the Christmas stamp featured a praying George Washington. In 1995 there was a close call to stop production of religious Christmas stamps but different public interest groups helped the Post Office to change its mind.

Today the Postal Service offers stamps for other religious and ethnic celebrations. The Hanukkah stamp debuted in 1996, the Kwanzaa stamp appeared in 1997 and the Eid stamp commemorating Muslim festivals was introduced in 2001.

Already the Postal Service has identified several works of art that it plans to use for future religious stamps and it doesn't expect to run out of images any time soon.

So as to safeguard and preserve this form of evangelization each Christmas, the Parish Evangelization Committee will offer the new religious Christmas stamp after all the Masses next weekend. The stamps will be sold in books of 20 valued at \$14.60 and exact change would be appreciated.


With the help and interest of the Evangelization Committee we can be assured that the religious stamp will "stick" around for a long time to come. God bless you!
