Dear Parishioners,

At this time of the year our prayer focuses on the right to life especially as we pray for the protection of unborn children. "A Prayer for Pregnant Mothers"

O Blessed Mother, you received the good news of the Incarnation of Christ, Your Son, with faith and trust. Grant your protection to all pregnant mothers facing difficulties.

Guide us as we strive to make our parish communities places of welcome and assistance for mothers in need. Help us become instruments of God's love and compassion.

Mary, Mother of the Church, graciously help us build a culture of life and a civilization of love, together with all people of good will, to the praise and the glory of God, the Creator and Lover of Life.




This weekend we also celebrate the *Baptism of Our Lord* which closes the Christmas season and opens Ordinary time.
