
The Rectory Office will be closed this Monday, February 17th in observance of Presidents' Day. However, all emergency calls will be answered promptly.



This past week we celebrated St. Valentine's Day and the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes.



more important to you than money and things. If you are hungry then you appreciate food more. If you are sad then sometimes it's easier to remember to pray.


