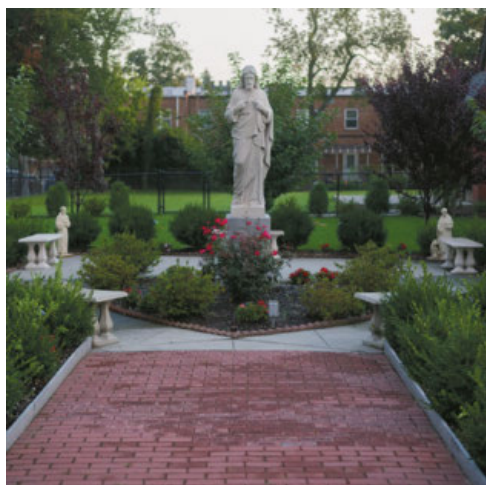

Dear Parishioners,

This week, as we observe the holiest time in the Church Year, especially the Sacred Triduum, may the days ahead deepen our awareness and love for the Paschal Mystery—the passion, death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Please see the special bulletin flyer today which contains the Holy Week services beginning tomorrow on Reconciliation Monday. Keep the flyer somewhere prominent in your home for other family members to read and join us for Holy Week.

Consider the following as you ponder the Passion of Christ this week:

We give glory to You, Lord, who raised up Your cross to span the jaws of death like a bridge by which souls might pass from the region of the dead to the land of the living. We give glory to You who put on the body of a single mortal man and made it the source of life for every other mortal man. – *St. Ephrem of Edessa*

Ultimately, in the battle against lies and violence, truth and love have no other weapon than the witness of suffering. – *Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI*

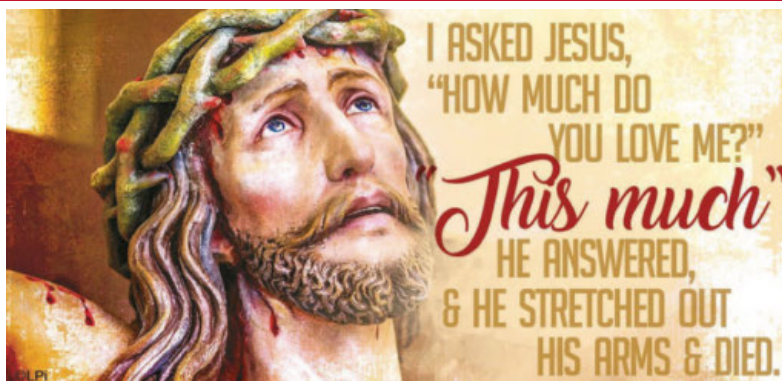
Do you realize that Jesus is there in the tabernacle expressly for you – for you alone? He burns with the desire to come into your heart. – *St. Therese' of Lisieux*

The washing of the feet and the sacrament of the Eucharist: two expressions of one and the same mystery of love entrusted to the disciples, so that, Jesus says, “as I have done... so also must you do” (Jn 13: 15). – *St. John Paul II*

The Cross is the word through which God has responded to evil in the world. Sometimes it may seem as though God does not react to evil, as if he is silent. And yet, God has spoken, he has replied, and his answer is the Cross of Christ: a word which is love, mercy, forgiveness. It also reveals a judgment, namely that God, in judging us, loves us. 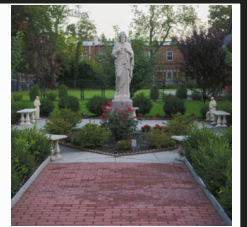

HOLY TRIDUUM COLLECTIONS

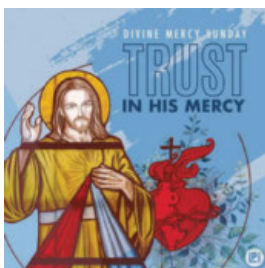
The offering received on Good Friday will be given in support of the Shrines in the Holy Land and on Easter Sunday they will assist the Saint John Vianney Fund in support of retired priests in the diocese.

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE are in effect on Good Friday. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY is on Sunday, April 27th. Based on the Divine Mercy message shared with St. Faustina Kowalska all the faithful implore God's mercy for the entire world, to be merciful and forgiving towards others and to trust completely in God.

On April 27th, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed in our church at 3:00 PM.

Come with family and friends and pray this devotion which has helped many.

Palm Sunday, the Sunday before Easter, marks the beginning of **Holy Week!** Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. Crowds lined the streets and greeted Jesus waving palm branches and shouting, "Hosanna!"



HOLY WEEK

The Triduum: The 3 days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, are considered one continuous celebration of Jesus's death and resurrection.

April 17th - **Holy Thursday** - *Remembers the Last Supper and Jesus washing his disciples' feet.*

April 18th – **Good Friday** - *marks the day Jesus was crucified.*

April 19th – **Holy Saturday** - *marks a time of waiting and preparation. This is the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, a time we remember Jesus's burial and we anticipate his resurrection.*

April 20th – **Easter Sunday** - *Celebrates Jesus's resurrection.*

Faith Formation Updates:

Grade/Level 7 students should have submitted their Letter to the Pastor to the Faith Formation office. All Grade/Level 7 students should work towards completing their community service hours by May 2025. **All Grade/Level 7 requirements including completion of their MCFD coursework must be met in order to receive a confirmation interview appointment in June.**

Students in Grades 1, 3, 4, 5 and 6 should complete their *My Catholic Faith Delivered* coursework by no later than May 15th.

Grade/Level 2 children must complete their MCFD coursework by May 1st in order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist.

On Good Friday morning, JESUS, who had been arrested the night before, was judged by Pontius Pilate, the ROMAN governor. Pilate had him WHIPPED. Then to make fun of Him the SOLDIERS made a CROWN of THORNS and put it on His head. They threw a purple cloth on Him and beat Him with RODS, saying, "Hail, KING of the JEWS!" Then Pilate had Jesus brought out in front of the people and asked them what they wanted to do with Him. The people, who had welcomed Him into JERUSALEM a few days before with their HOSANNAS, now shouted that He should be crucified.

So Jesus was made to CARRY a heavy CROSS out of the city and up a big HILL. Because He was so weak from being beaten, a man named SIMON of Cyrene was forced to help Him. The soldiers tore off Jesus' CLOTHES and attached Him to the cross with NAILS through His hands and feet.

Jesus offered His life for our SINS. He hung on the cross for three HOURS until He DIED. Nearby were His mother MARY, JOHN the Apostle, and Mary MAGDALEN. After He died a soldier stuck a SPEAR into His side to be sure He was dead.

Did you know that at every MASS we re-offer Jesus' sacrifice on the cross in an unbloody way on the altar?

Holy Week

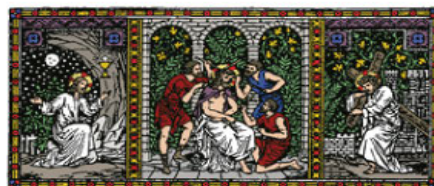
Today is the beginning of Holy Week, when we specially remember the last days of Jesus and His death on the cross.

The Sunday before Jesus died, He came riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. All the people cheered for Him. They laid down their cloaks and palm branches on the road to honour Him. That was Palm Sunday.

Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins so that we could go to Heaven. That's why it's called "Good" Friday! 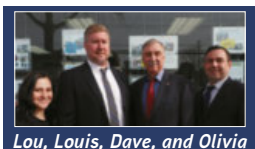
